		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Individuals who are a contact of a positive case but do not live with or have not stayed overnight with the individual are advised to follow the <a href="#">'Living safely with respiratory infections, including COVID-19'</a> guidance.</li> <li>The school will take advice from the local HPT regarding specific precautions to be taken in response to managing a case or outbreak.</li> </ul>				
Contact with individuals who develop coronavirus symptoms at school	H	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>If anyone develops coronavirus symptoms while at school, they are advised to go home and informed of the <a href="#">national guidance</a> on what to do if you have symptoms of a respiratory infection, including coronavirus, or test positive for coronavirus.</li> <li>Pupils going home after displaying symptoms who are awaiting collection by a parent are moved away from others to a location that can be ventilated.</li> <li>If the pupil needs to use the toilet while awaiting collection, they use a separate bathroom if possible. The bathroom is cleaned and disinfected using standard cleaning products before being used by anyone else.</li> <li>Anyone who comes into contact with a symptomatic individual washes their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds with soap and running warm water or hand sanitiser. Managing respiratory infections, including coronavirus	M	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Staff with symptoms of a respiratory infection, including coronavirus, who have a high temperature and do not feel well enough to work will be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with others until they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to return to work.</li> <li>• Staff will be supported to work from home where possible.</li> <li>• Pupils with mild respiratory infection symptoms, such as a runny nose, sore throat or slight cough, who are otherwise well, are able to continue to attend school.</li> <li>• Pupils who are unwell and have a high temperature will be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with others until they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to return to school.</li> <li>• Anyone with symptoms of a respiratory infection, including coronavirus, will be advised to follow the <a href="#">UKHSA guidance</a>.</li> </ul>	Y	Headteacher	26.04.22	L
Managing confirmed cases of coronavirus	M	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Staff, pupils and parents are informed, via email, of how the school responds to confirmed cases of coronavirus.</li> <li>• Where an individual in the school community tests positive for coronavirus, the school follows public health advice and procedures outlined in the <a href="#">Infection Control Policy</a>.</li> <li>• Individuals who test positive for coronavirus follow the <a href="#">UKHSA guidance</a> on precautions to take.</li> </ul>	Y	Headteacher	26.04.22	L

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Staff who have coronavirus are supported to work from home where possible. If this is not possible, the staff member and their manager discuss other options.</li> <li>Staff with a confirmed case of coronavirus will be advised to not come to school for 5 days after they took a test. If the staff member feels well enough to return to work after 5 days, they will do so, but will avoid contact with any member of the school community who is at higher risk of serious infection from coronavirus for 10 days after the day they took a test.</li> <li>Pupils with a confirmed case of coronavirus will be advised to not come to school for three days after they took a test. If the pupil feels well enough to return to school after 3 days and they do not have a temperature, they will do so.</li> </ul>				
PPE	L	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Risk assessments are conducted on a case-by-case basis to determine whether staff require PPE to carry out other tasks and duties.</li> <li>Used PPE is disposed of properly using bins provided around the school. Staff and pupils are told not to use recycling bins for the disposing of PPE.</li> <li>All PPE waste is put in a plastic rubbish bag which, once full, is tied and placed in a second tied bag and stored in a suitable and secure place, marked for storage for 72 hours. Following this period, it is put in the communal waste area.</li> </ul>	Y	All staff	26.04.22	L

Hand cleaning and respiratory hygiene	M	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Suitable handwashing and sanitising facilities are provided for individuals to wash their hands regularly.</li> <li>• Adequate amounts of tissues and bins are available in the relevant areas.</li> <li>• Skin-friendly sanitising wipes are used as an alternative for pupils who are at risk of ingesting hand sanitiser, where appropriate.</li> <li>• Visual aids are displayed throughout the school reminding pupils to wash their hands regularly and follow the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach.</li> <li>• Pupils are supervised, where appropriate, when using hand sanitiser to ensure they do not ingest any.</li> <li>• Younger pupils and those with complex needs are supported to ensure they adopt good hand cleaning and respiratory hygiene practices.</li> <li>• Individual risk assessments are conducted for pupils with complex needs who struggle to maintain good respiratory hygiene.</li> </ul>	Y	All staff	26.04.22	L
Cleaning	M	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The school maintains an appropriate cleaning schedule which includes the regular cleaning of areas and equipment, e.g. twice per day. There is a particular focus on frequently touched surfaces.</li> <li>• The school is cleaned in line with the daily cleaning schedule and the <a href="#">COSHH Policy</a>.</li> </ul>	Y	All staff	26.04.22	L



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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Enhanced cleaning is undertaken if there is an outbreak at the school, in line with advice from the local HPT.</li> </ul>

Unvaccinated members of staff	H	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The school encourages all eligible staff to take up the vaccine offer and publicises the benefits using impartial, factual information in line with NHS guidance.</li> <li>The school enables staff who are eligible for vaccination to attend booked appointments, including during term time where possible.</li> <li>The school does not discriminate against any member of staff who has not being vaccinated for any reason, and adheres to its duties under the Equality Act 2010.</li> </ul>	Y	Relevant staff	26.04.22	M

Communication		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The headteacher liaises with the LA where necessary and includes any local guidance in the Staff Handbook, where required.</li> <li>• The school's website is kept up-to-date with any important information regarding the running of the school during the coronavirus pandemic, e.g. local arrangements.</li> <li>• The headteacher liaises with the trustees about possible arrangements for running the school, where necessary.</li> <li>• All staff, pupils, parents, visitors and volunteers are made aware of the symptoms of respiratory infections, including coronavirus, what to do if they display symptoms, and what to do if others display symptoms.</li> <li>• The SLT is actively present around the school to provide additional support, advice and reassurance.</li> </ul>				
Ventilation	M	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The school has a clear approach to increasing ventilation and minimising risk of aerosol transmission.</li> <li>• Particular consideration is given to ventilation when hosting events where visitors such as parents are on site, e.g. school productions.</li> <li>• Where possible, the windows of occupied rooms are open. In cold weather, where this causes issues with thermal comfort, the following mitigations are put in place where possible:</li> </ul>	Y	All staff	26.04.22	L

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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Classrooms are rearranged to minimise the discomfort caused by draughts from open windows, e.g. by moving desks and chairs</li> <li>- High level windows are opened in preference to low level windows, to reduce draughts</li> <li>- Ventilation is increased while the space is unoccupied, e.g. during break- and lunchtimes.</li> </ul>				
Managing outbreaks	M	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The school has a plan in place to manage outbreaks of respiratory infections, including coronavirus.</li> <li>• The school will contact its local HPT if there is:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A higher than previously experienced and/or rapidly increasing number of staff or pupil absences due to acute respiratory infection.</li> <li>• Evidence of severe disease due to respiratory infection, for example if a pupil or staff member is admitted to hospital.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• If an outbreak or incident is suspected, the school will review and reinforce infection prevention and control measures that are already in place.</li> </ul>	Y	Headteacher	26.04.22	L
